

USS DE HAVEN

# 1962

Destroyermen of the USS De Haven joined an elite corps of Navy marksmen this year. Firing their twin-mount five-inch guns; De Haven gunners succeeded in winning all possible awards for excellence in gunnery. De Haven's director crew maintained their sharp eye by winning their third consecutive award. De Haven's anti-submarine team added to the victory by winning their second consecutive award for excellence. De Haven's record of excellence has followed the ship throughout its 18 year naval career. The ship was commissioned in 1944 and in 18 months of service in World War II she traveled better than 150,000 miles accounting for three enemy aircraft, three assists and the sinking of two ships. She also participated in the Korean Conflict. In 1960, De Haven got a face lifting by undergoing the Navy's FRAM II modernization process after which she joined Seventh Fleet in October 1961 as a member of Destroyer Flotilla ONE, homeported in Yokosuka, Japan



#### CO BIOGRAPHY

Commander James W. Montgomery, USN, a native of Malden Missouri, was graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy with the class of 1945 in June of 1944.

Initially serving in the cruiser New Orleans (CA-32) in the Western Pacific until the end of World War II, he was ordered to USS Spokane (CLAA-120) in 1946 where he served in Mediterranean and Northern European waters. From 1948 to 1950 he was assigned to LSMR 514, an amphibious unit of the Atlantic Fleet.

Having served as Flag Lieutenant to Commander Cruiser Division SIX from 1951 through 1952, he was next assigned to the Naval Academy at Annapolis where he performed the duty of Company Officer.

In 1954, CDR Montgomery assumed duties as Executive Officer in *USS Sproston* (DDE-577) and two years later took command of *USS McCoy* (DE-365). He continued in Hawaiian waters when he again was given a command assignment in *USS McGinty* (DE-365).

In 1958 CDR Montgomery commenced post-graduate training at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute from which he received his Master of Science Degree in Management and Industrial Engineering in 1959.

He subsequently served at the Weapons Station in Yorktown, Virginia until 1961 when he was ordered as Commanding Officer of *DeHaven*.

CDR Montgomery married the former Arlene Albright of Reading Pennsylvania, and has two sons, Thomas William and James Jr. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. B. E. Montgomery of Cape Girardeau, Mo.





### XO BIOGRAPHY

Lieutenant Commander Bruce R. Banks, U.S. Navy, a former resident of Syracuse, New York, graduated from New York State Teacher's College, Cortland, New York with a B.S. in education in 1948, after having served as an air crewman aboard anti-submarine aircraft in the North and South Atlantic in World War II.


From 1948 to 1951, LCDR Banks taught high school Biology and General Science at Fairport, New York. In March 1951 he was recalled to active duty, and in August 1951 he was selected for officers training. He was graduated from OCS at Newport, Rhode Island, and received his commission in December 1951.


LCDR Bank's first duty was Administrative Assistant and Assistant Fire Control Officer in *Randolph* (CVA-15). After a 2½ year tour on the attack carrier, LCDR Banks was ordered to the *Lloyd* (APD-63) as Executive Officer; in 1956 he was assigned to the *Spiegel Grove* (LSD-32) as Operations Officer.

From 1958 to 1960, LCDR Banks served as Instructor in Naval History at the NROTC Unit at Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois.

In June 1960, Mr. Banks was ordered to the Zellars (DD-777) as Operations Officer, and in January 1962 he joined the De Haven (DD-727) as Executive Officer.

Lieutenant Commander Banks married the former Beverly Jean Yaple of Syracuse, New York, and has two daughters; Susan Dianne and Cynthia Anne.
