#### **Mount Rushmore National Memorial**

Mount Rushmore National Memorial is a massive sculpture carved into Mount Rushmore in the Black Hills region of South Dakota. Completed in 1941 under the direction of Gutzon Borglum and his son Lincoln, the sculpture's roughly 60-ft.-high granite faces depict U.S. presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln. The site also features The Lincoln Borglum Museum with interactive exhibits, a restaurant, visitor centers, a gift and book shop. Lunch is on your own at the restaurant.

## Deadwood

#### History of the real Deadwood, South Dakota

The discovery of gold in the southern Black Hills in 1874 set off one of the great gold rushes in America. In 1876, miners moved into the northern Black Hills. That's where they came across a gulch full of dead trees and a creek full of gold and Deadwood was born.

Practically overnight, the tiny gold camp boomed into a town that played by its own rules that attracted outlaws, gamblers and gunslingers along with the gold seekers. Wild Bill Hickok was one of those men who came looking for fortune. But just a few short weeks after arriving, he was gunned down while holding a poker hand of aces and eights – forever after known as the Dead Man's Hand.

Calamity Jane also made a name for herself in these parts and is buried next to Hickok in Mount Moriah Cemetery. Other legends, like Potato Creek Johnny, Seth Bullock and Al Swearengen, created their legends and legacies in this tiny Black Hills town.

You can find these colorful characters walking the streets of present-day Deadwood as a part of Deadwood Alive. This theater troupe reenacts the major historic events – like the Trial of Jack McCall and Wild Bill's assassination— that inspired the legends you know today.

Deadwood has survived three major fires and numerous economic hardships, pushing it to the verge of becoming another Old West ghost town. But in 1989 limited-wage gambling was legalized and Deadwood was reborn.

Today, the town is booming once again. You'll find modern-day casinos, resort hotels, full-service spas, big name concerts, and some of the best parties in the entire United States. Come walk in the footsteps of our legends and make history in Deadwood. We've been entertaining guests since 1876.

## Some of the attractions in Deadwood

#### **Adams Museum**

In 1930 pioneer businessman W.E. Adams founded the Adams Museum in Deadwood, with the purpose of preserving and displaying the history of the Black Hills. He donated the building to the City of Deadwood.

### Some of the Black Hills' greatest treasures are on exhibit at the museum including:

- Potato Creek Johnny's original 7.346 troy ounce gold nugget
- Beloved American illustrator N.C. Wyeth's pencil sketch drawing of Western legend Wild Bill Hickok
- The mysterious Thoen Stone record of the Ezra Kind party's discovery of gold in the Hills in the 1830s
- A rare one-of-a-kind plesiosaur (marine reptile)
- Interactive games including an augmented reality sandbox, brain teasers, and life-sized puzzles
  The story of Deadwood's long history with activities of questionable repute is revealed in Risky
  Business. The exhibit delves into vices such as gambling, prostitution, and crime. Find out how and
  why these somewhat seedy activities were a mainstay in Deadwood's history for so many years.
  Learn of the lawmen who often looked the other way and those who were relentless in their quest
  for law and order.

#### **Historic Adams House**

The Historic Adams House was built in 1892 by Deadwood pioneers Harris and Anna Franklin. Local contemporary press described the home as "the grandest house west of the Mississippi". The elegant Queen Anne-style house heralded a wealthy and socially prominent new age for Deadwood, a former rough and tumble gold mining town.

Influential business leaders of Deadwood often gathered for dinner in the Adams House dining room to enjoy an evening meal and discuss the day's current events. Guests would be treated to fine dining on a table set with monogrammed silverware, 18-karat gold charger plates, and crystal

wine glasses. The food was superior, the room was opulent, and the conversations were lively. It was a grand way to pass the evening.

It has been said the parlor was the most important room in any Victorian home. The parlor at the Historic Adams House was no exception. With a cozy fireplace, a beautifully sturdy upright piano, and a Victrola that played all genre of recordings, the parlor assured that guests were surrounded by the best when they called upon the occupants of this lovely home.
